Report on the Audit of the Standalone Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of **ASSOCIATES INFRA DEVELOPERS PRIVATE LIMITED** ('the Company') which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31 March, 2020, the Statement of Profit and Lossfor the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2020, and its profit for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Information Other than the Standalone Financial Statements and Auditor's Report

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation of the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Management Discussion and Analysis, Board's Report including Annexures to Board's Report, Business Responsibility Report, Corporate Governance and Shareholder's Information, but does not include the standalone financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the standalone financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the standalone financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the standalone financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in section 134(5) of the Act with respect to the preparation of these standalone financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance, total comprehensive income, changes in equity and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the Ind AS and other accounting principles generally accepted in India. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the standalone financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the standalone financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Note-1

1 Significant accounting policies

i. Basis of accounting and preparation of financial statements

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared to comply in all material aspects with applicable accounting principles in India, the applicable Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') read with rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014, the provisions of the act (to the extent notified) and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, to the extent applicable. The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis under the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

ii. Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognised in the periods in which the results are known / materialise.

Valuation of cost of land was made on the basis of saleable area for Phase I on the basis of management representation till 31.03.2017 how ever for better clerity and because of change in drawing it is calculated on the basis of land area consumed for Phase-1 vis-a vis total land area consider for approval.

iii Inventories

- a. Inventroy other than Work in Progress are valued at lower of cost or net realisable value
- b. Work in Progress is stated at cost consisting of Land cost, land development right, construction cost, allocated administration and finance cost. Construction materials purchased are directly charged to respective projects.
- c. During the year Cost of land apportioned in construction on the basis of area used in the ongoing project. However in earlier year the same is done on the basis of total saleable area.

iv. Cash flow statement

Cash flows are reported using the indirect method, whereby profit /(loss) before extraordinary items and tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of non-cash nature and any deferrals of accurals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated based on the available information.

v. Depreciation and amortisation

Depreciation is calculated by considering useful life of asset, cost and residual life as per new provisions of the Companies Act 2013. Depreciable amount for asset is the cost of an asset, or other amount substituted for cost, less its residual value. Useful life is taken as per the schedule-II of the Companies Act, 2013, according to class of assets. For assets existing on 01.04.2014, date of purchase is considered to calculate expired life and then remaining useful life and WDV amount are taken to calculate depreciation rate on WDV method.

For the assets whose remaining useful life is Nil then the differential amount between book value and residual value has been charged to Profit and Loss account. For the assets purchased during the year, the calculation has been made prorata for the period from date of purchase to year end.

vi. Revenue recognition

Sale of Flats

Revenue in respest of sale of flat is recognised on the basis of percentage completion method as prescribed by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India

vii. a. Tangible fixed assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation. The cost of fixed assets includes interest on borrowings, if any, attributable to acquisition of qualifying fixed assets up to the date the asset is ready for its intended use and other incidental expenses incurred up to that date. Machinery spares which can be used only in connection with an item of fixed asset and whose use is expected to be irregular are capitalised and depreciated over the useful life of the principal item of the relevant assets. Subsequent expenditure relating to fixed assets, if any, is capitalised only if such expenditure results in an increase in the future benefits from such asset beyond its previously assessed standard of performance.

viii. Employee benefits

Employee benefits include provident fund, superannuation fund, gratuity fund, compensated absences, long service awards and post-employment medical benefits.

ix. Taxes on income

Current tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the year as determined in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Deferred Tax: Deferred tax is recognized subject to consideration of prudence on the basis of timing differences being the differences between taxable income and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted as on the Balance Sheet date. Deferred tax liability is recognized and carried forward only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that it will be paid in future.

x. Impairment of assets

The carrying values of assets / cash generating units at each Balance Sheet date are reviewed for impairment. If any indication of impairment exists, the recoverable amount of such assets is estimated and impairment is recognised, if the carrying amount of these assets exceeds their recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the net selling price and their value in use. Value in use is arrived at by discounting the future cash flows to their present value based on an appropriate discount factor. When there is indication that an impairment loss recognised for an asset in earlier accounting periods no longer exists or may have decreased, such reversal of impairment loss is recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss, except in case of revalued assets.

xi. Accounting Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets:

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Contingent Liabilities are recognised only when there is a possible obligation arising from past events due to occurence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the Company or where any present obligation cannot be measured in terms of future outflow or resources or where a reliable estimate of the obliation cannot be made. Obligations are assessed on an ongoing basis and only those having a largely probable outflow of resources are provided for. Contingent assets are netither recognised nor disclosed in the financial statements

xii. Earnings per Share

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. For computing diluted earnings per share the numerator is adjusted for dividend, interest and other charges to expense or income relating to the dilutive potential equity shares and computed in the same way.
